**Pledge of Allegiance**

The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

**Hayward Civic Club – Cancellation of the July 4<sup>th</sup> Community Picnic & Fireworks Event**

Mayor Munich informed those present that the annual July 4<sup>th</sup> Community Picnic & Fireworks Event will not take place this year due to the Coronavirus Pandemic.

**Jon Weber, River's Edge Saloon – Request for Permit to Display Fireworks**

A motion was made by Ald. Kennell, seconded by Ald. Williamson to approve the request, as presented by Jon Weber, River's Edge Saloon, for a permit to display fireworks on the evening of July 4<sup>th</sup>; display to start at dusk and continue for no more than one hour. Motion carried.

**Hayward Area Chamber of Commerce – Request for Downtown Pop-Up Shops**

A poll of the council members revealed that a majority of the members were in favor of moving forward with Pop-up Shops downtown, but would like additional information and opinions of the downtown business owners before approving the idea. A motion was made by Ald. Miller, seconded by Ald. Swan to table any decision regarding downtown pop-up shops until next month so that additional information could be obtained and presented. Motion carried.

**Chequamegon Mountain Bike Festival – Requests regarding the staging of the 38<sup>th</sup> Annual Event & Pro/Elite Starts on Main Street on Saturday, September 9, 2020**

A motion was made by Ald. Gillis, seconded by Ald. Williamson to approve the requests as presented and submitted by Peter Spencer in a letter dated May 14, 2020, for the 38<sup>th</sup> Annual Chequamegon Mountain Bike Festival. Motion carried.

**Ben LaBarre – Request for the Creation of Tax Incremental District No. 6 in the City of Hayward**

A motion was made by Ald. Gillis, seconded by Ald. Kennell to table any additional decisions regarding Tax Incremental Financing District 6 until next month. Motion carried.

**Fair Housing Proclamation**

Attorney Kelsey read aloud, on behalf of Mayor Munich, a proclamation proclaiming that it is the policy of the City of Hayward to comply with the Federal Fair Housing Act and Wisconsin Statutes, Section 106.50 to ensure equal opportunity in housing for all persons regardless of race, color, national origin, religion, sex, familial status or disability.

  - A. Pine Point Lift Station Electrical Upgrade – Information Only. Director McCue explained that Xcel Energy is talking about upgrading the electrical lines from single phase to three phase power near the Pine Point Lift Station. Director McCue felt that if the power lines are upgraded to three phase, the City ought to upgrade the electronics and pumps at the Pine Point Lift Station to coincide with the three phase power so as to elevate future issues.
  - B. Easements for California Avenue Sewer Interceptor Project – Information Only. Director McCue stated that he is working with Sawyer County regarding the easements for the California Avenue Sewer Interceptor. Director McCue is awaiting a proposal from

Sawyer County. Once a proposal is obtained, Director McCue will bring the information back to the full council.

  - D. Bidding out for the sale of the twenty-eight green light poles removed from Main Street; minimum bid of \$50 per pole.

2. Address the groundwater quality issue by:
  - A. Pursuing advanced nitrogen treatment and nitrogen reduction options prior to the next wastewater treatment plant upgrade.
  - B. Continuing to sample groundwater from various monitoring wells and analyzing the samples on a quarterly basis.
