# RESOLUTION FOR URBAN FORESTRY GRANT AND URBAN FORESTRY CATASTROPHIC STORM GRANT PROGRAMS

#### **Authorizing Resolution**

WHEREAS, the applicant, City of Hayward, is interested in obtaining a cost-share grant from Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources for the purpose of funding urban and community forestry projects or urban catastrophic storm projects specified in §23.097(1g) and (1r), Wis. Stats.;

WHEREAS, the applicant attests to the validity and veracity of the statements and representations contained in the grant application; and

WHEREAS, the applicant requests a grant agreement to carry out the project;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, the applicant, City of Hayward, will comply with all local, state, and federal rules, regulations and ordinances relating to this project and the cost-share agreement;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the applicant will budget a sum sufficient to fully and satisfactorily complete the project and hereby authorizes and empowers the City of Hayward Mayor, its official or employee, to act on its behalf to:

- 1. Sign and submit the grant application
- 2. Sign a grant agreement between applicant and the DNR
- 3. Submit interim and/or final reports to the DNR to satisfy the grant agreement
- 4. Submit grant reimbursement request to the DNR
- 5. Sign and submit other required documentation

- 2. From Public Works (Committee Meeting Canceled lack of quorum):
  - A. The sale of the 1995 Vac/Jet truck to Dan Thompson, Thompson's Sand & Gravel, for an amount of \$25,000 instead of receiving a trade-in allowance from MacQueen Equipment toward the purchase of the 2005 Vac/Jet truck (\$140,000).
  - B. The sale of the 2004 International dump truck; and to allow Director McCue to look for and to purchase a newer used dump truck for an amount up to \$30,000.
  - C. The hiring of Keith Wehmhoefer to fill the public works laborer position vacated by Robert Lang.
  - D. Drafting an amendment to the City's noise ordinance, in order to make the decibel level limits less restrictive, to simplify the language and to align the City's ordinance with Sawyer County's noise ordinance.
  - E. Information Only. Director McCue informed the mayor and council members that the construction materials for the pavilion at the Tot Lot are estimated to cost approximately \$42,000; after the purchase and installation of the new playground equipment, approximately \$3,500 in donated funds remain. The pavilion will not be constructed this year.
  - F. An amendment to the agreement with Ayres Associates, as presented, for the W 2<sup>nd</sup> Street Project to include CDBG-PF Grant Resubmittal, Topographic Survey, Preliminary Design, Biddable Plans & Specifications and Environmental Reports for an amount of \$93,100.
  - G. The agreement with Ayres Associates, as presented, for Professional services relating to the construction of California Avenue between 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> Streets to include Topographic Survey; Preliminary Design and Chapter 30 Permitting services in the amount of \$39,400.
